

WE WELCOME: EMILIE MAHL


Dear friends of the ATF.

Dr. Andrés Pacheco Lozano New Chair of the MWC Peace Commission



The Executive Committee of Mennonite World Conference (MWC) affirmed new General Council representatives to the commissions and elected Andrés Pacheco Lozano as chair of the Peace Commission. Andrés Pacheco Lozano is a member of the Iglesia Menonita de Colombia, a research associate at the Chair for Peace Theology and Ethics at VU University Amsterdam and a lecturer at the Doopsgezind Seminarium (Dutch Mennonite Seminary), co-director of the Amsterdam Center for Religion and Peace & Justice Studies, and a post-doctoral fellow at the Center for Peace Church Theology at the University of Hamburg (Germany). He lives in the Netherlands.



ATF AWARDS SCHOLARSHIPS FOR THE FIRST TIME

The ATF is awarding scholarships for the first time this year. This is intended to support research projects dealing with the historical legacy of the Anabaptist movement, the development of peace theology and ethics in general, peace education, or the theology of peace churches (especially Mennonites).

The scholarships support people who want to gain further scientific qualifications with a doctorate or post-doctorate. However, interested parties who wish to use the scholarship for further training in the above-mentioned topics can also apply. Doctoral and post-doctoral scholarships are awarded for twelve months with a possible extension for another twelve months; shorter terms are possible, if the funding is for a project with a more limited time frame.

Basic Course "Anabaptist-Mennonite Theology and History"

Beginning in the fall of 2023, there will be a new continuing education offering that the Center for Peace Church Theology has developed together with the Bienenberg Education Center: Anabaptist-Mennonite theology and history will be taught in seven modules. The modules take one month each and are offered one evening a week via Zoom. A new course starts every year.

The basic course, "Anabaptist-Mennonite Theology and History", is designed for new pastors from non-Mennonite backgrounds starting their work in a Mennonite congregation, as well as for lay-Membran of congregations and anyone else interested from a variety of denominational backgrounds.

Those who have taken all seven modules and completed minor qualification work receive a certificate. The individual modules are supplemented by manuals. Thus, individual modules or units could also be offered in communities.



War and peace - these are the classical topics of peace theology and ethics. In the past, the "doctrine of just war" on the one hand and various pacifist positions on the other were polarized against each other, but in the international ecumenical movement an understanding of "just peace" was gradually worked out that made a broad consensus possible.

However, when it comes to concrete threats, such as Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine or a decadeslong civil war in Colombia, church positions also seem to fall into old polarizations. In two seminars (block seminar and proseminar) traditional positions with regard to "war and peace" will be analyzed, theological and ethical arguments will be discussed and these will be examined on the basis of concrete case studies.

MENNOFORUM - ON THE WAR IN UKRAINE AND THE PEACE PROCESS IN COLOMBIA

On May 5 and June 2, 2023, the Mennonite Church in Hamburg-Altona will again offer a space for discussions on current ethical and political issues, with guests from politics, business, society and the church. In cooperation with the Mennonite congregation, two evenings are planned in which students will also participate.

Whereas in the past, within the Christian tradition, it was above all the "doctrine of just war" on the one hand and various pacifist positions (including those of the peace churches) on the other that were polarized against each other, an understanding of "just peace" was gradually worked out in the international ecumenical movement that made a broad consensus possible.

However, when it comes to concrete threats, such as Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine, a "war on terror" in Afghanistan, or a decades-long civil war in Colombia, church positions (along with their ethical justifications) again seem to fall into old polarizations.

On the first evening we will discuss the war in Ukraine with philosopher Prof. Olav Müller, among others, and on the second evening we will focus on the peace process in Colombia, among others with Dr. Andrés Pacheco Lozano. In each case, the voices of those directly affected will also have their say, and possibilities will be highlighted that lie beyond the "mainstream".

The audience will be actively involved in the mennoForum and should form their own opinion in the course of the evening. The discussions at the dinner beforehand (from 6 p.m.) and the conclusion with bread, juice and wine (from 9 p.m.) also offer a good opportunity for this.



GMP III June 15-18th 2023

The 3rd Global Mennonite Peacebuilding Conference and Festival (GMP III) will be held June 15-18, 2023, at Eastern Mennonite University in Harrisonburg, USA. The theme of the conference and festival is "Coming Together: The Journey of Faith and Peace." The GMPs have become Anabaptist-Mennonite organized spaces where practitioners, academics, church workers, artists and pastors, among others, can meet and share their experiences, knowledge and practice in peace work. The ATF team will actively participate.



SUMMERSCHOOL IN AMSTERDAM
- (DE-)CONSTRUCTION OF REALITIES

Why is it so difficult to develop a shared vision of peace? How do you deal with it when the other person doesn't seem ready to talk about peace? How is one's own understanding of peace shaped and what factors determine my view of reality? These questions determine the theme of this year's Summer University in Amsterdam. A group of students from various disciplines at the University of Hamburg, who are completing the one-year curriculum "Peacebuilding", will meet there for a week of intensive exchange with students from the master's program "Peace, Trauma, Religion" at the Vrijen Universiteit Amsterdam.



WAR AND PEACE - 500 YEARS OF NONVIOLENCE

"That thy highest care may be for peace and concord" - words from the "Lamentation of Peace" by Erasmus of Rotterdam. Since Russia's attack on Ukraine, war and the hope for peace that accompanies it have once again become more prominent in the minds of people in Europe. How do we deal with wars and what are our ideas about peace? How can Anabaptist statements be placed in today's discourse and in the debates of past centuries?

From the beginning, the Anabaptists were convinced that a right Christian life according to the premises of the words of Jesus Christ and the Sermon on the Mount could only be a life of non-violence and peaceableness. While in the beginning they were persecuted for these convictions, the way the authorities dealt with the Anabaptists changed from the 17th century on. Where subjects were needed, authorities were willing to tolerate Anabaptists and grant them privileges that exempted them from bearing arms and serving in wars. Beginning in the 19th century, however, as privileges gave way to equality for all citizens, the question of military service arose again for Mennonites.

This course provides an overview of 500 years of Anabaptist history with a focus on nonviolence and peace witness. It begins April 25, 2023, and meets Tuesdays, 6:30-8:00 p.m. via Zoom.



Continuities, new beginnings and a farewell

On October 28, 2022, the ATF invited people to celebrate and give thanks under the theme "Seek peace and pursue it" (Ps 34:15). We are grateful that the work of the ATF continues to be supported by financial donations. For example, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in North Germany has decided to extend the secondment of Pastor Dr. Marie Anne Subklew to the AMG for another four years, now with a full-time position. This is a sign of excellent ecumenical sisterhood. The position of PD Dr. Astrid von Schlachta has also been increased. 


Fernando Enns is mandated by the WCC to accompany the peace negotiations in Colombia as an international observer


The World Council of Churches (WCC) has sent letters to Colombian President Gustavo Petro and Colombian Peace Commissioner Danilo Rueda expressing the WCC's support and solidarity for peacebuilding in Colombia and confirming the WCC's readiness to participate in the dialogue process between the Colombian government and the National Liberation Army (ELN). The WCC has appointed Dr. Humberto Martin Shikiya, general secretary of Qonakuy, a network of Protestant universities in Latin America and the Caribbean, and Prof. Dr. Fernando Enns, Mennonite and director of the Center of Peace Church Theology at the University of Hamburg.


